Trees Atlanta will host its third annual Tree Sale on Saturday, October 19, 2002 at the Education Complex in Piedmont Park from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. The sale will feature over one hundred varieties of unusual and hard to find trees, concentrating on varieties native to the South and Georgia. Featured trees include two-winged silver bell, beech, paw paw, pignut hickory, sassafras, yellowwood and 9 varieties of native oaks. Other varieties available include dogwoods, white oaks, American Hollies, needle palm, American Elm and tulip poplars. Trees Atlanta has also combed the Southeast to find non-invasive exotics such as china fir, flame, Fantasy Crepe Myrtle, parrotia, fragrant snowbell and yellow-flowering magnolias. Trees and plants are available at discounted prices and all proceeds will benefit Atlanta neighborhood tree planting projects. Representatives from Trees Atlanta will be available to answer questions about the organization, volunteering, and tree care and placement. Trees Atlanta is dedicated to protecting and improving our metropolitan environment by planting and conserving trees. Each year, Trees Atlanta volunteers and contractors plant over 2,000 trees.

The Education Center complex in Piedmont Park is located just west of Monroe Drive off of Park Drive. Follow Park Drive into the park and bear right to the Education Center.


